Narrative:

On Monday, November 30, 2015, at approximately 2350hrs, Palmdale Sheriff's Station received multiple calls from students who attend Antelope Valley Community College (AVC). The students all received the same text message from an unknown individual. The text message made a vague threat and told the students to stay home from school.

Lancaster Sheriff Station was notified of the incident and immediately started an investigation. Additional resources were assigned to investigate the threat made, and ensure a safe campus.

At this time, deputies do not believe the threats to be credible, but are still investigating and will have an increased presence on both, the Lancaster campus and the Palmdale campus.
